

# What to Expect During Construction *(and Where to Find Assistance)*



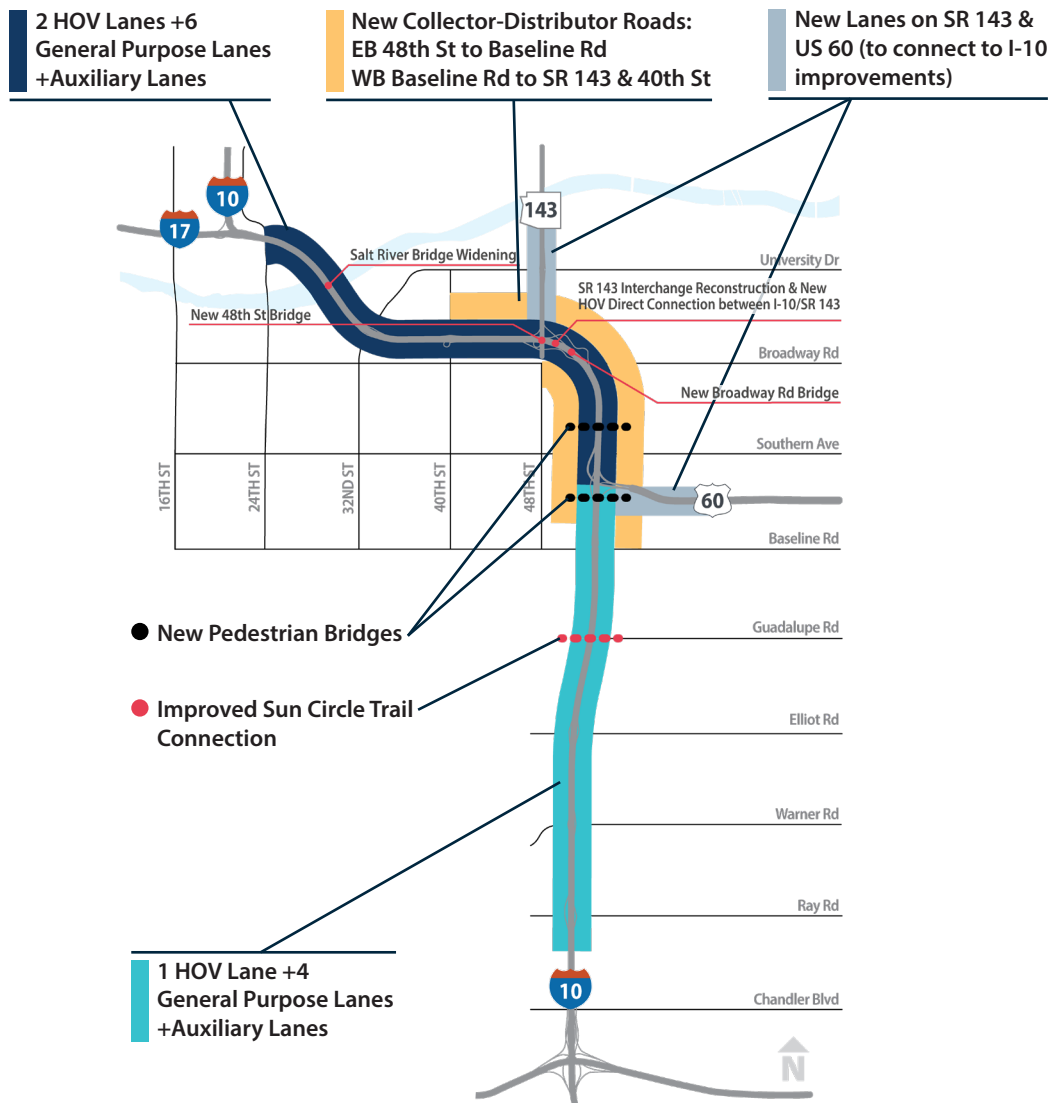
The Arizona Department of Transportation is about to begin a major project to rebuild 11 miles of Interstate 10 from Loop 202 (Santan/South Mountain freeways) to Interstate 17. ADOT anticipates work will begin in summer/fall 2021 and will include reconstruction of the State Route 143 and U.S. Route 60 (Superstition Freeway) interchanges and add capacity to the freeway, all by the end of 2024.

## What you can do:

- Get involved! Learn about the project, sign up for email updates and attend public meetings.
- Communicate with your customers. Let them know you're open. Offer promotions to attract business and let us know if you need a map to route customers to your location.
- Does your business offer something construction workers can use? Let us know and we'll make the crews aware of it.
- Make sure you have a contact person on the project team you can call or email with questions or if a problem arises.
