Travel Alert: Two closures of Interstate 10 in both directions are being scheduled over the next month. Expect delays and allow extra travel time.

Although it's April, we're not foolin' ... I-10 will be closed in both directions from 10 p.m. Friday, April 22, to 4 a.m. Monday, April 25, for SRP utility-relocation work.

- Eastbound I-10 will be closed between State Route 51 and SR 143.
- Westbound I-10 will be closed between SR 143 and I-17.

The following ramps will also be closed:

- The eastbound I-10 on-ramps between Third and 40th streets.
- The southbound I-17 on-ramps at Seventh Avenue and Seventh Street.
- The westbound Loop 202 (Red Mountain Freeway) ramp to eastbound I-10.
- The southbound SR 51 on-ramp at McDowell Road.
- The ramp from southbound SR 51 to eastbound I-10.
- The westbound I-10 on-ramps between Elliot Road and 32nd Street.
- The westbound US 60 (Superstition Freeway) on-ramp at Mill Avenue.
- The westbound US 60 ramp to westbound I-10.



While SRP's closure is in place, Broadway Curve Constructors will take advantage of the opportunity to shift the work zone and repair the freeway pavement. By combining this work with the SRP closure, the project team can eliminate the need for a separate highway closure.

It *may* happen again in May:

A second closure of I-10 in both directions is tentatively scheduled between US 60 (Superstition Freeway) and Loop 202 (Santan/South Mountain Freeway) from 10 p.m. Friday, May 6, to 4 a.m. Monday, May 9, for additional utility relocation work. If the closure is confirmed, we will post information on the [I-10 Broadway Curve Improvement Project website](#) and on “The Curve” free mobile app.

The map below illustrates where east- and westbound I-10 will be closed from April 22 to April 25, as well as detour routes. Traveling to Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport? Allow plenty of extra drive time and plan to use the entrances on Loop 202 (Red Mountain Freeway) or State Route 143:
