



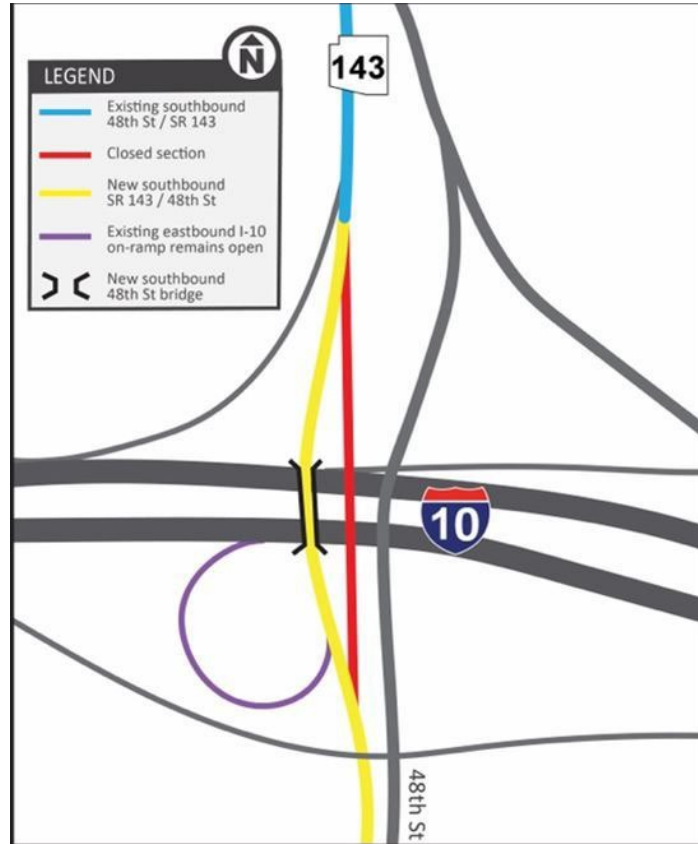

This month, there's a lot to love about all the progress on the 11-mile [Interstate 10 Broadway Curve Improvement Project](#). Let's list the ways. A brand new bridge is now open to southbound traffic on 48th Street; widening work at the Salt River bridges continues; and work on the new US 60 ramp to westbound I-10 is in full swing, in preparation for the construction of the new Collector-Distributor roads.

As construction continues, we ask you to slow down, avoid distractions and drive 55 mph in the work zone.

Project's first new bridge opens to traffic on southbound 48th Street

On Monday, Jan. 23, the project team celebrated an important milestone with the opening of the project's first new bridge. The new bridge replaced the southbound 48th Street bridge over I-10. Coming up next: Plans to open the northbound 48th Street bridge and the new Broadway Road bridge over I-10 this spring. Stay tuned for more information about the removal of the old 48th Street and Broadway Road bridges.



Widening work on the Salt River bridges

Workers are busy this month at the Salt River bed, filling the drilled shafts with concrete and preparing for the piers that will support the new, widened I-10 bridges. When completed, the bridges will have six general purpose lanes and two HOV lanes in each direction.

Westbound US 60 ramp to westbound I-10 work continues

Workers are constructing the Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) retaining walls next to the new ramp that will connect westbound US 60 to westbound I-10. Once completed, workers will build the new westbound Collector-Distributor (CD) road under this bridge, shown at right. Drivers can expect to begin using this new ramp in the spring.

Speeding in the work zone

We receive hundreds of questions and comments through our quarterly Construction Operations surveys. In January's survey, we received multiple comments expressing concern about drivers who speed through the work zone.

Please remember the maximum speed limit is 55 mph.

The project team has taken many steps to curb dangerous driving and speeding, such as hiring extra Department of Public Safety officers to patrol the project work zone during non-peak times when speeding through the project work zone is more frequent. Your vigilance helps to ensure the workers stay safe and that you arrive at your destination safely. Plan ahead for upcoming closures Feb. 17-18

The I-10 Broadway Curve Improvement Project has the following full closures in the project area scheduled in February:

- Eastbound I-10 will be closed between US 60 and Loop 202 (Santan/South Mountain Freeway) from 10 p.m. Friday, Feb. 17, to 10 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 18, for bridge, barrier and overhead sign work.
- Guadalupe Road, including the bridge over I-10, will be closed in both directions between Pointe Parkway and Calle Sahuaro from 10 p.m. Friday, Feb. 17, to 10 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 18, for bridge work.
